Loudon did not convey enthusiasm for the material. His lectures were frequently unrelated to the topics in the reading. Loudon's lecturing improved toward the end, but mispronunciations and use of nicknames for historical figures were confusing. Despite obvious knowledge of the material, it was presented in a disorganized manner; a website with lec-

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ture notes would have been helpful.

Respondents found Ward to be enthusiastic about the course material. Students felt that the assignments needed to be spread out through the year rather than being crammed into one semester.

Ward spent time making sure that students knew how to write a proper history essay. A few students did not enjoy Ward's lectures style, they found her to be repetitive and that she read from her notes too much. The majority of students although, enjoyed this course enough to want to take it again.
