Vukov was said to be knowledgeable and well-prepared for lectures. However, despite his enthusiasm, some students found him to be unapproachable and condescending. Students found the supplementary notes useful, and believed Vukov gave fair evaluations. They suggested posting notes online.

Carleton's lecture notes were often "unorganized" so it was difficult for students to determine which concepts were important or not. Students

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found the topics very interesting, but it would have been more helpful if Carleton showed the class how to do the statistics rather than just providing the end results.

Students suggested including more labs and projects involving student-collected data, as well as using Excel rather than Minitab. There was a discrepancy between the weight of statistics and biology during lectures as compared to on exams. Students mentioned the tutorials were extremely helpful.
