
History Students' Association

Students enjoyed Brownlee's lectures, however, they seemed disorganized without a course outline to help students prepare for the topics to be covered on specific days. This course was heavy on reading, some remarked that the required reading was far more than other second year courses and upper year seminars. The exam value being 45% of the final grade seemed excessively weighted.

Students agreed that Brownlee was an effective lecturer - he provided valuable insights into the material beyond what was in the textbook. The lecture concepts were easy to grasp as Brownlee used plan language, along with interesting anecdotes. One big concern for students was that the lecture room was locked promptly after class began, which was a problem for students already rushing to be on time, arriving to find the door locked and unable to sit in on a class they had paid for.
