Students generally agreed that Kokaz was enthusiastic and approachable. Many students thought her lectures were useful; however, a large number disagreed since they thought the organization of lectures was confusing. Also, students complained that Kokaz tried to fit in too much material in the 2 hours, making it difficult to take notes. Many IR students felt that this course focussed too heavily on the economic side of international relations, leaving them unable to understand these sections of the course unless they had previous economic knowledge. Students also complained that the required readings were too long and repetitive, and hence not worth the \$250+ they paid for them.

Finally, students felt that the midterms/essays were not a proper reflection of their abilities; many thought that the expectation for these essays was unclear, leading to confusion. In conclusion, students generally liked the instructor, but thought that it was too extensive a workload for a 2nd year course.
