Most students commended this instructor's enthusiasm and appreciated her efforts to make the course material interesting. Many liked her creative teaching methods noting that she encouraged class participation through her use of props and activities. Students generally found her to be approachable and many described her as a good instructor.

Response to the course structure was less positive. Many felt that the lectures were difficult to follow and the majority felt that too much material was crammed into the one hour lecture. Students felt that the lectures moved to quickly and found it difficult to absorb the many facts, dates and names that were presented. Some noted that they would have preferred a more indepth evaluation of certain topics rather than a quick general survey and others thought that the slides (while useful) could have been used more effectively. Many disliked the tutorial readings, stating that they were both too long and too dense. Similarly, the first assignments were not well received and many thought that research essay would have been more useful. Some did, however, find the material enjoyable and others noted that the instructor helped to make the topic more interesting than they had anticipated.

Many agreed that there were too many required readings and some felt that there was not enough feedback given on assignments. Several students felt also noted that the instruction assumed a high level of background knowledge and focussed on theory and debate rather than a historical introduction to the topic. As there was no prerequisite many felt overwhelmed by the material and although most found the course interesting, they would have preferred more straightforward lectured and readings. Some students also believed that the instructor exhibited a clear political bias and wished that he presented the topics in a more balanced way.

As well, some students felt that the material could have benefitted from a concentration on broader, over-arching themes as opposed to minute details. Students universally agreed that tutorials were of little value as they neither enhanced nor expanded upon the material covered in lecture.

The instructor was enthusiastic and organized. Students especially appreciated that he wrote lecture outlines on the board before class, although a few commented that posting the same information online would have been more convenient.
