The delivery of the material was criticized by a few students for being a bit dry.

Despite the fact that assignments were not marked in a more efficient manner, and despite the technicality of the textbook, overall, Kalmar's lecture was thoroughly enjoyed.

Students had a lot of difficulty with Jermyn's section of the course. Many commented that the assignments took too long to get back, and the expectations were not clear. Tutorials were highly recommended by students.

Many found the lectures enjoyable and liked Jermyn's usage of videos. Students felt that they would have been better able to grasp the material if slides were used. Many found it hard to write notes because Jermyn spoke too quickly.
