Wollesen presented an engaging lecture with clear and informative powerpoint presentations. Some students found his humour off-putting and were uncomfortable asking questions, however, his knowledge and personal experience in the field was extensive and showed during the lecture.

Students also felt that goals and expectations needed to be communicated more clearly and that more time should be given for the completion of assignments. Readings were useful but did not always pertain to the lectures and many seemed to require more base knowledge in art history than was usual for an introductory course.

and that the work was graded harshly. Some felt that perhaps the lecture sessions were too short and that the learning experience would benefit by having a tutorial. Students would also have appreciated it if the lecturer could be available for consultation on assignments.

Students found the topics interesting but many felt that the lectures were packed with too much material without sufficient explanation by the instructor or accessible class material on FADIS.

Many students complained about the overall class structure, such as lack of breaks during the 2 hour lecture, beginning lectures on the hour (not 10 mins after, which is unfair to students who have classes before), and unclear requirements/ goals of the class.

The instructor was very enthusiastic and knowledgeable about the subject matter, but the majority of the students felt that it could have been presented in a much more articulate and eloquent way. Many found the instructor very friendly and approachable during the office hours and email correspondence.
