

## Introduction

SASSA is an academic organization that promotes the critical interrogation of South Asian Studies. Our goal is to help students access and critically assess debates, discussions, categories, and practices relating to South Asian Studies. SASSA is also dedicated to raising student awareness about social justice issues that can be related to the critical study of colonialism, globalization, and other such broad academic concepts. SASSA does not approach the study of South Asian "culture" to celebrate or affirm it. The goal of SASSA is largely to question the kind of identity politics and problematic multiculturalism that makes the segregation and packaging of culture appear desirable.

The long-term goals of SASSA are to build efforts to increase critical course options in South Asian Studies by lobbying for equitable resource allocation from the University towards the program and its courses as opposed to a model based on the availability and interests of private funders.
