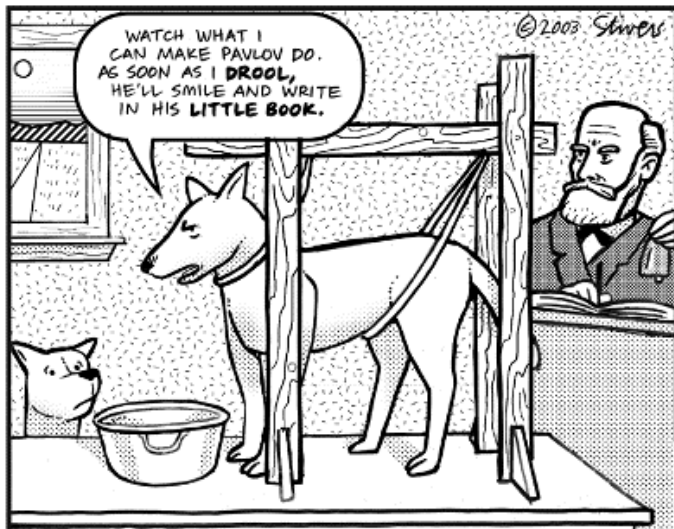


PSYCHOLOGY STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION
