KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Professor Jennifer Campbell, Department of Computer Science

Professor Jennifer Campbell serves as a Professor in the Teaching Stream and recently completed a three-year term as the Associate Chair of Undergraduate Studies in the Department of Computer Science here at U of T. She holds a Bachelor of Science from the University of Prince Edward Island and a Master of Math from the University of Waterloo. Renowned for her innovative teaching methods, she has significantly contributed to U of T's computer science education by developing a "flipped" approach to CSC108, the Department's introductory programming course, with active learning and online components. Within the Faculty of Arts and Science, she helped lead the transition to online teaching and learning during the COVID-19 pandemic. Beyond her classroom, she co-founded the Second-Year Learning Community (SLC) program which provides second-year students with a sense of community and professional development opportunities. Her exceptional dedication to teaching and educational leadership at U of T was recognized with the prestigious 2021 President's Teaching Award, the University's highest honour for teaching.
